How long can it rain! Many looking up at the clouds wonder just how long it will rain, or how long it will take for the clouds to rain themselves dry. This never happens; the air is never rained dry. But since the rain comes not only from moisture which was already in the air over a certain place, but also from imported air continually brought in by the wind, rain may continue as long as the process which is making it rain continues. This may be for a short or a long time. A change of the wind may cut off the supply of moist air, and the rain will stop; or bring in air of greater water content and intensify the rainfall.
