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Seasons and the weather! The seasons as known in the middle latitudes are each three months long, and are supposed to correspond with certain stages of agriculture. Due to the perversity of the weather, however, unseasonable weather may occur in any season. For instance; August, a summer month, may be cooler on the average than its succeeding month, September, a fall month, March, a spring month, may be colder than its preceding month February, a winter month. The highest temperature of the year frequently occurs in August, whereas July is on the average the warmest month of the year. Likewise, the lowest temperature often occurs in February, and not in January, right in the dead of winter.
