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Diurnal wind changes! Although not always discernible, there are progressive changes in wind direction during the day. The explanation is that the wind blows away from the warmest region, because the sun's heat expands the air and causes it to move outward. In the morning on almost calm days, the wind will be in the east, in the forenoon in the south, and in the late afternoon in the west; or as some say, "the wind follows the sun." At night there are return currents. These diurnal shifts are obscured by strong cyclonic winds, but they do strengthen or weaken these winds according to their motion at the time.
