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Cloudbursts! Sometimes people smile incredulously at stories told about cloudbursts, but there are evidences that water has at times actually streamed down; never, however, over a large region but only in spots. These evidences are holes in the ground 25 to 30 feet in diameter and from three to six feet deep. Examination indicated that these holes were made not by washes but by water poured down from above. This can happen when tornadoes occur in mountainous regions. Tornadoes, by the great force of their ascending currents, can support a great accumulation of water. Later, this falls by the bucketful.
