Climatic change! Nearly everyone believes that the climate is changing, meaning that it is changing in our own time and generation. Some of the reasons given are that the winters are either more or less severe, that the rainfall is heavier or lighter, that the summers are cooler or warmer, or other data. There may be many facts that seem to indicate climatic change, but one is only justified in assuming that the climate is changing only after a careful analysis of all information. For instance, a region may have a few years of decreased rainfall that justifies the inhabitants in moving away, because there was <sup>barely</sup> enough moisture under normal conditions. This migration is not good evidence, because later on normal rainfall may again prevail.
