Climate! The climate of a place determines more than anything else what people may live and what plants may grow there. Plants and animals, if they survive at any given place, are adapted to its climate. Note the Eskimos of the Arctic, the Negroes of Africa, and the fairer-skinned people of the middle latitudes. All of them are adapted to the climates of their homelands. When a people move to a new land which is much different in climate, they do not survive, or if there are survivals, they are the hardy ones, and the type changes slowly to an adaptable type. Plants and animals also die off if transported and are not adapted to the new climate. But all animals, including humans, and plants as well, may survive a moderate change in climatic environment.
