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Weather and war! Everyone rightfully associates good weather with good flying conditions. But when nature sets about it, however, she can make flying just about impossible - fog, sleet, snow and icing conditions will just about nullify fighting by the air arm, but it takes more than that to completely stop seapower. If weather forecasters predict a stretch of really bad weather for airpower, then is the time for seapower to strike because then it will be free from attack by air. But, on the whole, weather is seldom so bad that airpower is actually useless: it may most always be used either as a major arm or as a necessary assistant in any conflict.
