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Weather on the Atlantic; Considerable interest is now centered on the weather in the North Atlantic. Between Newfoundland and the British Isles there may be January and February storms of considerable dimensions and great strength, accompanied by rain, snow or sleet, but no hurricanes of tropical origin will be encountered. The winds will be generally westerly, averaging about 16 knots on either coast, and in midocean about 24 knots. The skies will be cloudy or partly cloudy most of the time, but fogs will be much less frequent than in summer. Temperatures will vary on the average from 33 degrees on the Newfoundland coast to 49 degrees on the British coast.

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
