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Icebergs! These big chunks of ice often form magnificent sights. One, for instance, measured 2 1/2 miles long, 2 1/4 miles wide, and 153 feet high out of water. Another in the Antarctic extended 800 feet above the ocean's surface. As icebergs are extremely dangerous to shipping, attempts are made to destroy them with high explosives. Much more efficient, however, is a warm south wind, with the Gulf Stream washing against them. Mariners keep far away from icebergs, because one can never tell just when they are going to flop over, as they become unstable by pieces breaking off underneath or by being worn off by wave action.

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
