Moon and weather! Besides believing that the moon affects one when sleeping in its light, causing insanity and perhaps other things, many feel that the moon affects the weather. There are rules for planting certain crops in relation to the moon's phases, which are rigidly observed. One moon-weather superstition is the belief in a wet and a dry moon. A wet moon is one with the horns of its crescent pointing nearly up, for then it holds water; the dry Moon has its horns pointing down. The fact that many believe just the opposite, that is, a wet moon is one with its horns pointing down (for then it empties its water on the earth) should be enough to discredit all teachings of the moon's affecting the weather.
