Reigning wind! As the wind blows, so is the weather. But wind direction is nowhere so important as a weather factor as in the Mediterranean countries. There the wind, according to direction, brings hot or cold, rain or drought. There were as many as twelve winds named by the Greeks and Romans. The "Bora" is the well-known northerly wind, anciently called "Boreas", which dries the crops in summer and brings cold rain or snow in winter. Hannibal, in one of his battles with the Romans, disposed his troops so they had the Bora at their backs; but the wind blew dust into the eyes of Romans, to their utter confusion.
