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Atlantic and Mediterranean in March! Although there is a decrease in the frequency of storms and in the violence of the gales over the Atlantic, March is wintry and stormy, and occasionally it proves to be the stormiest month of the winter season. There is a sharp increase in fogs, which occur two days out of five along the Grand Banks. In the Mediterranean sea, west to northwest winds still prevail along the sailing routes; while strong northers are prevalent in the Gulf of Lions. In the Aegean, winds are mostly north-easterly except in the eastern portion where they are mostly south or southwest. Fogs are infrequent and the temperatures average about 60 degrees.
