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Icebergs! After being calved from about 20 glaciers on the northwest Greenland coast, icebergs have an 1800-mile journey before reaching the Grand Banks. Their journey is greatly impeded by the broken character of the eastern Canadian coast; they are calved in summer, spend two winters on the way south, and begin to appear this month. Most of the bergs disintegrate, and only about one out of twenty reach Newfoundland. Hundreds are grounded on the Banks, never reaching the open sea routes. Detecting bergs by lookouts stationed aloft and on decks of ships is still the safest method. Under-water sonic methods are subject to inaccuracies due to differences in water temperature and salinity.
