Climatic divisions! The great climatic divisions, torrid, temperate and frigid, are entirely too general for many climatic studies, especially those relating to agriculture. Scientists have been and are studying the deviations within those large divisions of climate and these deviations are called "micro-climates". They study, for instance, how in relatively small areas, the heat from the sun is variously absorbed and disposed, due to color of soil; changes in heat conductivity due to differences in composition and water content; the air movements including vertical and horizontal currents, the water content of the air, evaporation and dew deposits.
