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Three moons! "Information please" may propound this question: "What do 'monsoon,' 'typhoon,' and 'simoon' mean. And one of the quartet would explain that "monsoon is a seasonal wind blowing more or less steadily from the interior of a continent to the sea in winter and oppositely in summer. The southwest monsoon is famous in India for bringing rain. A "typhoon" is a term applied in the Far East to a storm similar to the West Indies hurricane. And a "simoon" is an intensely hot and dry wind of the deserts of Africa and Asia often accompanied by dust and sand. In Arabia the same word, simoon, also means poison: this wind is not poisonous but it has bad and often fatal effects.
